Spring 2021

Spring has been more like late Winter as of late. May has been so cold at night that some of the local fruit farmers may run into problems. We had ice on my deck a week ago going to untie my bow lines to head out on the lake. Most Charter boats dockside inspections were completed this last week. At last, some prediction for above normal weather and the lilacs are blooming!

The good news is the lake trout fishing has been excellent for our first trips out on the lake and the morel mushrooms are popping. Visible clouds of salmon fry are in the Pere Marquette and it looks like a good hatch. We did not have very high water all Spring where it tends to put the fry up into the woods and when the water drops they cannot get down to Lake Michigan.

Steelhead numbers were down this Spring. The run was more of a trickle into the river system with some of the lowest river water levels in history. Lake Michigan is 15 inches lower than last year at this time and still 18 inches higher than the average level in May.

Thank you to each individual that volunteered to participate with the net pen project this year at the Ludington State Park's Sable River. This project takes countless hours for preparation, maintenance, planting, feeding, release of fish and pen removal / cleaning! Special thanks to Consumers Energy, MDNR Fisheries, and Ludington State Park employees for your help!

This is truly a community event that enhances our Great Lakes fishery along with providing education, and supporting tourism. It is a symbiotic relationship... everyone wins.

We placed in net pens 15,000 Coho salmon and did a direct plant of 25,000 at time of release. The idea of net penning the Coho is to provide both the opportunity for "imprinting" so they return to this area and acclimation for a better chance for survival.

Though net penning King Salmon has been happening for many years in many locations, LCBA is the first and only organization to net pen Coho Salmon in the state.

At this time the nets have been pulled and the project is compete. We can hope to see a return of this plant as "Jacks" as early as Fall 2021 and mature fish in 2022. This fall we should see returns of mature Coho from our Spring 2020 plant as well.

Hopefully you can catch a bunch in the big lake at Ludington, in the river or enjoy watching them trying to jump the Sable River dam at the Ludington State Park!


Do not forget to do your catch reports monthly. The MDNR will not be tolerating late submissions anymore. We have been notified they will be issuing tickets
